2009-10 Grant-in-Aid Program

To improve access to higher education for students throughout the tri-state region, Penn State Erie, The Behrend College, offers grants-in-aid to 2009 graduates from twenty select high schools in New York and Ohio. These grants cover the difference between in-state and out-of-state tuition at Penn State Behrend.

Grants-in-aid are designated for students who enroll in the Fall 2009 semester at Penn State Behrend immediately following high school graduation. Students will receive the grants as long as they maintain continuous enrollment at the college. Grant amounts for the 2009-10 academic year are approximately \$6,000 per student.

At Penn State Erie, The Behrend College, more than 4,600 students benefit from the learning opportunities and resources of a major research university provided in a student-centered college environment. Students can choose from thirty-four bachelor's degrees, six associate degrees, and two graduate programs: a Master of Business Administration (M.B.A.) and a Master of Project Management (M.P.M.).

We're ranked among the top public colleges and universities in Pennsylvania by *U.S. News & World Report* on a number of important measures, including student-to-faculty ratio, SAT scores, first-year student retention rate, and graduation rate. More than 75 percent of our students who go on to graduate with Penn State degrees complete their degrees at the college. Our beautiful 725-acre campus features more than 50 buildings, including on-campus residence halls, suites, and apartments for more than 1,650 students.
