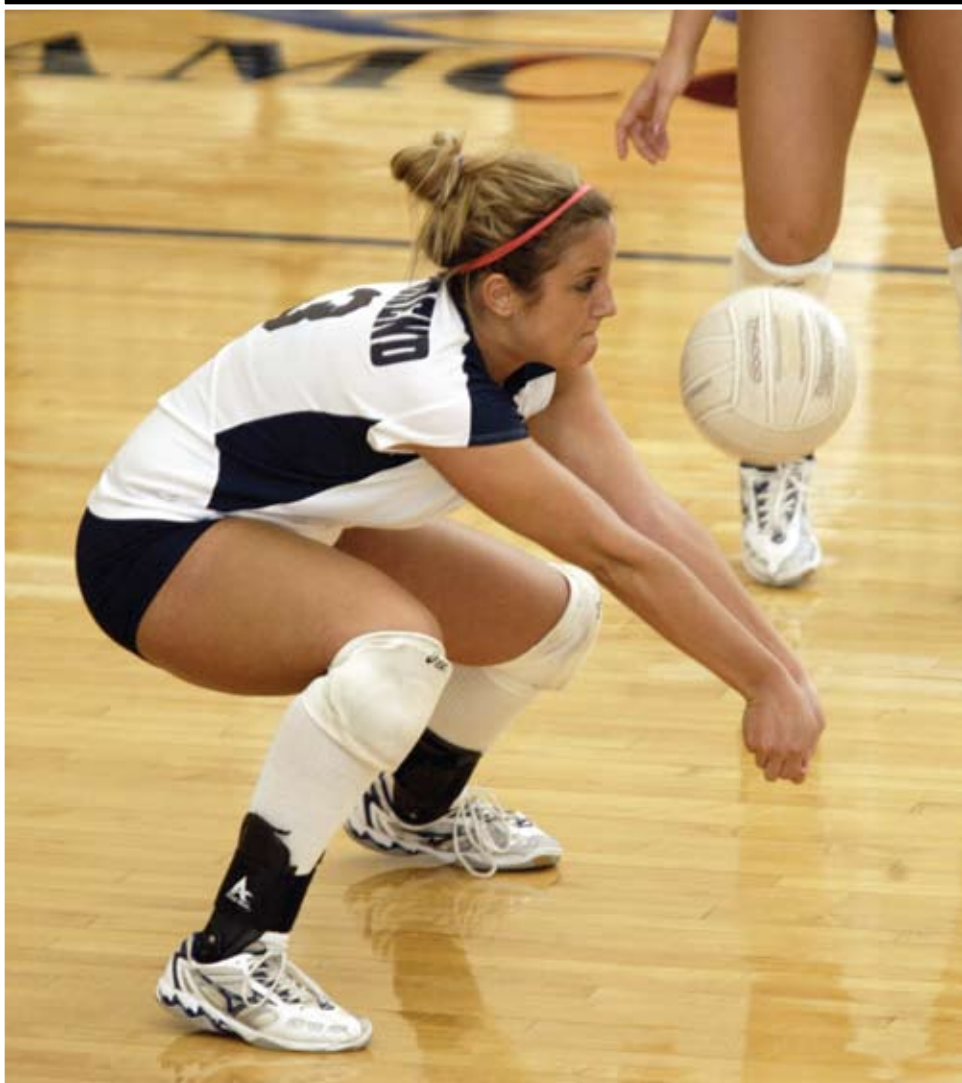

# Behrend Lions Volleyball

## 2008 Season Preview

The 2008 Behrend Lions volleyball team returns five starters from last year's squad and looks to blend that experience with a talented freshman class for a title run this season. After three straight seasons of competing in the AMCC Championship match, the 2007 Behrend team bowed out in the conference semifinals. The blue and white earned a share of the AMCC regular season title with an 8-1 record during conference play and finished at 18-12 overall.

Head coach Phil Pisano returns for his fifth season in charge of the Behrend Lions program. Pisano said, "Last year we accomplished some important things with a very inexperienced squad. Our upperclassmen gained valuable experience and we are excited to see that pay off for them this fall."

Joining Pisano on the sideline this year is fifth-year assistant coach Gerry Vensel. Former Behrend Lion Paige Payer joins the coaching staff for the first time, while Karla Murray returns to assist with coaching duties for the second season.

Brittany Hennessy (Hopewell/Hopewell) will be the lone senior on the 2008 team and will push to bookend her Behrend career by leading the squad to the AMCC title. The team won the conference championship in 2005 with Hennessy as a freshman and advanced to its first NCAA Tournament. She has been an all-conference team member as a libero in each of her three seasons for the blue and white, and enters the season with 1,662 career digs, just five digs from breaking the all-time school record.

Three junior starters return in 2008 with their sights set on a playoff run. Brooke Gallentine (Mt. Pleasant/Southmoreland) has racked up 2,083 assists in two seasons as a setter for the Behrend Lions. Outside hitter Carissa Johnston (Cambridge Springs/Cambridge Springs) pounded out 295 kills a season ago while being named honorable mention all-conference. First-team all-conference middle hitter Sheila Ogden (Grove City/Grove City) was the team's 2007 MVP after leading the squad with 315 kills and a .270 hitting percentage.

Pisano said, "Brittany, Brooke, Carissa, and Sheila are now very experienced players after having been starters and playing key roles the past few seasons. Their ability to play at a consistently high level will be a big factor in how far this team will go. I am excited to see how this group will lead our younger players, and eager to watch them accomplish great things on the court."

Starting middle hitter Jenna Kelly suffered an injury in the spring tournament and will miss the 2008 season, leaving two sophomores on this year's squad. Danielle Woods (Pittsburgh/Baldwin) and Aubry Regan (Edinboro/General McLane) return for their second season with the blue and white. Woods was the team's rookie of the year a season ago, leading the team in service aces while ranking second in digs and fourth in kills. Regan appeared in 32 games as a freshman and will work to produce a big season as a middle or right side hitter in 2008.

Eight freshmen join the Behrend Lions in 2008 and will look to make an immediate impact on the program. Four W.P.I.A.L. players begin their college careers, including

Kaitlyn Bianco (Aliquippa/Center), Liz Emerick (Hopewell/Hopewell), Alex Johnson (Imperial/West Allegheny), and Stef Kelley (Moon Township/Moon). The three District 10 players who join the blue and white are Lauren Dalton (Cochranon/Cochranon), Danielle Kindle (Erie/McDowell), and Ariel Mehlenbacher (Titusville/Titusville). The eighth freshman, Hilary Wadsworth (Randolph/Randolph Central) was on the New York All-State team a season ago. Pisano said, "This is an outstanding group that has the opportunity to contribute quickly for our team, with the talent and potential to make a huge mark on this program in the years to come."

A challenging schedule awaits the team in 2008 as the Behrend Lions will play at least 13 of their 20 non-conference matches against teams that won 20 or more games in 2007. The season begins with a trip to Kentucky for the Thomas More Invitational August 30 and 31. The following weekend the blue and white compete in the Behrend Invitational September 5 and 6 at home in the Junker Center, where the squad is 33-5 over the past three seasons. Conference play begins September 27 at home against La Roche, during a tri-match with Thiel. The Behrend Lions will also have two home matches televised on Image Sports, first against Fredonia on September 30 and then on October 29 versus AMCC opponent Pitt-Bradford.

The NCAA passed new rules for collegiate volleyball in the offseason, as the first four games, which are now called "sets" are played to 25 instead of 30 points. Teams are now limited to 12 substitutions per set, down from the old limit of 15. With these changes, matches are expected to be closer contests, with each point in the rally scoring set taking on greater importance. Pisano said, "Teams that can let go of one mistake instead of dwelling on it will do well, as giving up a run of points in the shorter sets will be very difficult to overcome. I like that this team has really worked on serving aggressively and looks to be one that can play solid floor defense, which should give us an opportunity to score points in bunches."

Pisano said, "Our immediate plans are to get healthy after some preseason injuries and work to grow as a team each day. I believe the potential of this team is quite high, and I know we are all determined to reach our long term goals of battling for the league title and returning to the postseason. The players know what it is going to take to reach our goals this fall and are anxious to begin this journey, and I am confident they are prepared to handle the challenges that await."

# Behrend Lions Volleyball

## Coaching Profiles

### **Head Coach Phil Pisano**

Phil Pisano is in his fifth year as head coach of the Behrend Lions. Since Pisano's arrival, the Behrend Lions are 90-39 overall with a stellar 33-3 mark in the AMCC. During that time, 11 career or single-season records have been set while the blue and white have earned 18 selections to the all-conference team and 24 academic all-conference honors. Pisano has also been named AMCC Coach of the Year in 2005 and 2006.

In 2007 the blue and white finished with an 18-12 overall record and advanced to the AMCC semifinals. The team captured a share of the AMCC regular season title with an 8-1 conference record.

His 2006 squad set a school record for wins, and captured a second straight AMCC regular season title with an overall mark of 29-4. The blue and white earned an ECAC bid and reached the tournament championship match, along the way earning the first postseason wins ever for the program.

In 2005 the blue and white captured the AMCC Championship and reached the NCAA Tournament for the first time ever. Behrend finished with a record of 26-8, including an impressive 9-0 mark in AMCC competition.

In 2003 Pisano served as an assistant coach with the Behrend Lions. In addition, he coached at Slippery Rock as an assistant to the women's volleyball coach from 1998-2003. He was also the coach and president of the SRU men's volleyball club team for three years while earning his undergraduate degree in marketing from the Rock.

Pisano currently serves on the NCAA Division III Mid-Atlantic Volleyball Regional Advisory Committee and the AVCA Division III Head Coaches Committee. He continues to participate in a variety of volleyball camps and clinics throughout the year.

Pisano completed his MBA from Behrend in 2005. In addition to his coaching duties, he serves as a lecturer in the health and physical education department and works as an assistant in the sports information office.

Gerry Vensel begins her fifth season as a member of the Behrend Lions volleyball staff.

Vensel brings a wealth of collegiate coaching experience to the Behrend Lions program. Since 1987 she has directed the State Champs Volleyball Camps, and previously spent nine years as the head coach of the Gannon Golden Knights. While guiding the Gannon program she led the team to an impressive 271-61 record, three NCAA regional championships and three Elite Eight appearances. She has continued working with high school and college programs since her stint at Gannon. Vensel, a three-time Coach of the Year, was also inducted into the Edinboro University Athletic Hall of Fame.

Vensel earned an undergraduate degree from Edinboro and MBA from Gannon.

Paige Payer joins the Behrend coaching staff for her first season in 2008.

Payer returns to the blue and white after a highly productive playing career for the team from 2003-2006. She was a three year starter and important team leader for coach Pisano's squad as a right side hitter. Payer was a big contributor on the 2005 AMCC Championship and NCAA Tournament squad as well as the 2006 team that reached the ECAC Championship Match. Payer played in 305 games during her career and posted 303 kills and 130 total blocks while being named to the AMCC academic all-conference team.

Payer was the John Zahniser Scholar Athlete Award winner for Behrend athletics after the 2006-2007 year. She graduated from Behrend in 2006 with a degree in communications and is now working toward her Master's in Education at Mercyhurst College.

Karla Murray begins her second season as a member of the Behrend Lions volleyball staff.

Murray is no stranger to the Behrend volleyball program, as she wrapped up a stellar playing career for the blue and white in 2006. Murray was a three-year starter for coach Pisano, and a team captain the past two seasons. She was an academic all-conference selection and also named to the All-AMCC team in 2006. Her 1,315 digs rank sixth all-time at Behrend. Murray helped lead the squad to its first ever NCAA Tournament appearance in 2005 and its first ever postseason victories in 2006 at the ECAC Tournament.

Murray graduated in 2007 with a degree in marketing and completed her MBA at Behrend this past summer.

# Welcome to Penn State Behrend

**P**enn State Erie, The Behrend College, offers more than 4,600 students the learning opportunities and resources of a major research university in a student-centered environment. The college offers thirty-four bachelor's, six associate, four pre-professional, and two graduate programs with twenty-two minors in four schools—the Sam and Irene Black School of Business, the School of Engineering, the School of Humanities and Social Sciences, and the School of Science—plus a nursing program.

Penn State Behrend is ranked among the top public colleges and universities in Pennsylvania by *U.S. News & World Report* on a number of important measures, including student-to-faculty ratio, SAT scores, first-year student retention rate, and graduation rate. More than 75 percent of our students who go on to graduate with Penn State degrees complete their degrees at the college. According to recent student surveys, ninety-six percent of those graduating seniors would recommend Penn State Behrend to friends considering college.

Our 725-acre campus features more than 50 buildings and is recognized as an arboretum through membership in the American Public Gardens Association. More than 1,650 students live in on-campus residence halls, suites, and apartments in buildings all named for commanders and ships that took part in the Battle of Lake Erie in the War of 1812.

Campus life is enriched by more than 110 clubs and organizations. The athletic program features twenty-one NCAA Division III varsity teams—ten for men and eleven for women—as well as intramural and club sports, and student fitness activities.

As part of a land-grant institution, Penn State Behrend is uniquely positioned to advance the economic, social, and intellectual welfare of northwestern Pennsylvania through research and outreach. Annually, the college funds nearly \$250,000 in undergraduate research opportunities. Outreach efforts include more than two dozen centers, programs, and initiatives for business and industry, area school students, and the community.



# Penn State Behrend Athletic Facilities

## Behrend Fields

The college's soccer teams compete on the Behrend Fields, located northwest of the baseball and softball complex and across the bridge over Trout Run.

The complex comprises four multi-purpose athletic fields and a putting green. The facility was created in 1988, thanks to a pacesetting gift of \$1.4 million from an anonymous donor. The fields are also used for intramurals and course instruction. They accommodate a variety of play configurations, including flag football and softball.

Other outdoor facilities on campus include lighted tennis courts and sand volleyball courts.



## Junker Center

The growth of athletics at Penn State Behrend has led to the development of new indoor facilities. The \$10.2 million Junker Center, which opened in the spring of 2001, comprises 72,800 square feet, including outstanding volleyball and basketball facilities.



The center features three all-purpose courts and a gymnasium seating 1,600, an eight-lane swimming pool, three-lane running track, jumping pits, aerobics room, locker rooms, offices, and a variety of exercise equipment. The fully equipped Jageman Fitness Room provides a variety of exercise equipment for students, faculty, and staff.

## Baseball and Softball Complex

Penn State Behrend's baseball and softball complex, located adjacent to the main campus entrance, ranks as one of the region's best facilities.



Each field features a built-in irrigation system, seventy-foot in-ground dugouts, batting cages, bullpens, scoreboards, a full warning track, permanent fences, a concession stand, and scorekeepers' stations.
