# Behrend Lions Women's Soccer

## 2008 Season Preview

The Penn State Behrend women's soccer team is positioning themselves to add more hardware to the trophy case in 2008. Entering the fall, the goal is to win their third straight AMCC Conference Championship. Behrend returns a mature group from last year's championship team. The 2007 team posted a record of 11-7-3 and earned the program's third bid to the NCAA Tournament.

"We are looking forward to defending our AMCC title in 2008," O'Driscoll said. "We know it will be challenging to win the league again, but we feel well equipped to do so. We have a good core of talented returning players, including four All-AMCC selections from 2007. The experienced players will be critical to our success both in terms of their level of play and their ability to help our new players acclimate into the culture of our program." Behrend has competed in ten of 11 AMCC championship games since the conference's inception in 1997-winning it all six times.

In 2008, the Behrend Lions will return seven starters and 11 letterwinners. Three seniors will lead the blue and white on their title defense this year. The midfield will be anchored by seniors Kim Chapman (Cranberry/Seneca Valley), Nikki Frisbee (Valencia/Mars), and Beth Manganaro (Pittsburgh/Chartiers Valley). Last season, Chapman was voted the program's Co-MVP, Frisbee was named the AMCC Player of the Year, and Manganaro tallied five goals, and they will work together to be a strong force up-top for the Behrend Lions.

"Kim, Nikki, and Beth are all really experienced players having played in three AMCC championship games and two NCAA Tournaments," O'Driscoll said. "I will be counting on them to provide a dynamic attacking front for our team in 2008."

First team All-AMCC selection Kayla Frost headlines the junior class. With a 1.24 GAA and nine shutouts, Frost is the cornerstone to the Behrend Lions defense. Along with Frost, back-up goalie Beth Lacy (Erie/Harborcreek) provides experience and depth. "We are fortunate to have strong goalkeeping in the form of Kayla and Beth to keep the opposition off the score sheet," continued O'Driscoll. "Also, talented midfielder Brittany Barbato (State College/State College) returns for her third year.

This fall the Behrend Lions will be returning five sophomores. Julie Bonomo (Export/Franklin Regional) and Kelly Thill (Wexford/Pine-Richland) were key pieces to the Behrend Lions defense in 2007 and look to keep Behrend on the winning path. Midfielder Jaclyn Stottlemeyer (Charleroi/Charleroi) will create space in the midfield, while forwards Caitlyn Elser (Cranberry/Seneca Valley) and Caitlin Tschappat (Butler/Butler) will push for time at the attacking position. As a freshman Elser scored two goals and had two assists, and along with Bonomo are both near definite starters this fall.

Twelve new freshmen will join the team in 2008. "We always work hard to bring in talented players to our program," said O'Driscoll. "I am extremely happy with the quality of our 2008 class. These players come from competitive club and high school programs and should make this transition to college well. Many of them will impact the team significantly as freshmen."

These freshmen should add depth to an experienced Behrend Lions squad. Among those competing for time are forwards Emily Lewis (Washington/Bishop Canevin), Rachelle Thompson (Scottsdale/Southmoreland), Erin McCreary (Pittsburgh/Seton-LaSalle), and Glennis Robash (Mars/Mars). Adding depth to the midfield is Mia Baltutat (Pittsburgh/Upper St. Clair),

Lindsey Steinsdoerfer (Pittsburgh/North Hills), and Kaitlin Wolf (West Seneca, NY/West Seneca West). Defending the goal will be Caitlyn Bleggi (New Castle/Neshannock), Kelsey Donegan (Pittsburgh/North Allegheny), Megan Falconer (Erie/Villa Maria), Chelsey Lewis (Washington/Bishop Canevin), and Heather Klimuszka (Rochester, NY/Greece-Athena).

Also giving the blue and white more experience in the midfield is Dana Cerminara (Cranberry Township/Seneca Valley) who is joining Behrend from Thiel College.



The Behrend Lions will kick off the season by hosting the Herb Lauffer Tournament the last weekend of August. The Herb Lauffer Tournament will begin the Behrend Lions 18 game journey towards their third straight championship. Behrend will begin play on August, 30, at 10:00 a.m. against Baldwin-Wallace in the opening game of the Herb Lauffer Tournament. The other half of the bracket has Geneseo kicking off against Wooster at 12:00 p.m. The consolation game is slated for Sunday at 10:00 a.m. followed by the 12:00 p.m. championship contest. The blue and white have captured the Herb-Lauffer Tournament titles in both 2000 and 2003. The blue and white will begin defense of their AMCC crown on September 27, when Mt. Aloysius visits the Behrend fields.

Coach O'Driscoll feels his team more than capable of brining home another AMCC title. "The AMCC is getting stronger every year, so we will have to be at our best again in 2008," said O'Driscoll. "The players are hungry to win the title again this year. Our focus will be on good daily practice habits, working hard, and having a team-first attitude. If we can work on these things over the course of the season, success will hopefully follow."

Historically, the Behrend women's soccer program boasts a 169-79-20 mark. The blue and white won four straight AMCC championships during the 1997-2000 seasons and have won the last two league titles. The blue and white have also finished as the league's runner's-up in 2001 and from 2003-2005. In addition, the Behrend Lions have also made five ECAC Tournaments and three NCAA appearances.

## Coaching Profiles

### Head Coach Patrick O'Driscoll

Patrick O'Driscoll enters his fifth season as the head coach of the Behrend Lions women's soccer program. O'Driscoll has led the program to four straight AMCC Championship games appearances, claiming titles in the 2006 and 2007 seasons. He has bolstered the winning soccer tradition at Behrend, forging a 53-22-9 record over four seasons.

A year ago the blue and white finished 11-7-3 and won the program's sixth AMCC Championship, defeating arch rival, Frostburg State, 2-1, and earned its third bid to the NCAA Tournament. The 2006 season showed much of the same success for the women's soccer program. With their third straight AMCC Championship trip, the blue and white again dropped Frostburg State in the title match. In the NCAA Tournament Behrend lost to Messiah, the defending National Champions. It marked the third straight season the program won 14 games.

In 2005 the blue and white enjoyed another outstanding season earning their second straight trip to the AMCC championship game, losing to rival Frostburg State 4-3 on penalty kicks. The blue and white played in their fifth ECAC Tournament and were selected as the number-one seed. Behrend finished the season with a record of 14-3-4, which tied for the fewest losses in school history, while O'Driscoll was named AMCC Coach of the Year. During the 2004, O'Driscoll's first year at the helm, the blue and white lost in double-overtime in the AMCC finals, 3-2, but were selected to participate in the ECAC Playoffs and posted a 14-6-1 mark.

In the summers of 2003 and 2005, O'Driscoll played soccer for the Fort Wayne Fever in Indiana in the Premier Development League (PDL). O'Driscoll spent four successful years playing for NAIA power National American University of South Dakota. As a four-year starter for the Mavericks, O'Driscoll helped steer the team toward three regional championship appearances, one national tournament bid, and a No. 11 national ranking. In his junior and senior year, O'Driscoll earned all-section honors and was tabbed team MVP as a senior. He also was a member of the bronze medal team at the 2002 Western New York Empire State Games.

O'Driscoll came to South Dakota from Aberdeen, Scotland. As a youth player in Scotland, O'Driscoll played for Glasgow Celtic F.C. and represented his country on the Scottish Schoolboys teams. O'Driscoll earned his bachelor's of science degree in business administration from National American University in 2001, and his master's in business administration in 2003 from Behrend. In addition to serving as the head coach, he will be a lecturer in the health and physical education department. O'Driscoll holds a U.S.S.F "A" License.

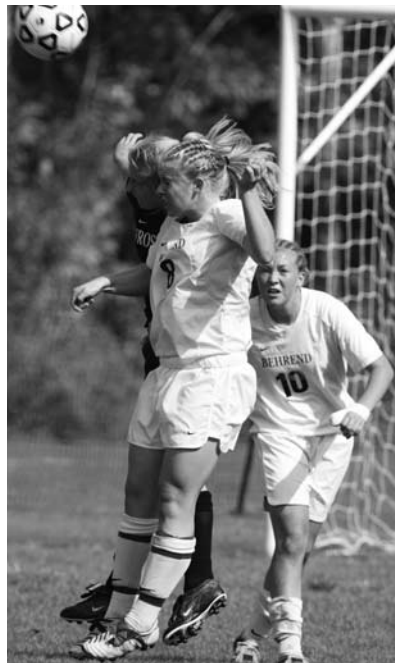

# Welcome to Penn State Behrend

**P**enn State Erie, The Behrend College, offers more than 4,600 students the learning opportunities and resources of a major research university in a student-centered environment. The college offers thirty-four bachelor's, six associate, four pre-professional, and two graduate programs with twenty-two minors in four schools—the Sam and Irene Black School of Business, the School of Engineering, the School of Humanities and Social Sciences, and the School of Science—plus a nursing program.

Penn State Behrend is ranked among the top public colleges and universities in Pennsylvania by *U.S. News & World Report* on a number of important measures, including student-to-faculty ratio, SAT scores, first-year student retention rate, and graduation rate. More than 75 percent of our students who go on to graduate with Penn State degrees complete their degrees at the college. According to recent student surveys, ninety-six percent of those graduating seniors would recommend Penn State Behrend to friends considering college.

Our 725-acre campus features more than 50 buildings and is recognized as an arboretum through membership in the American Public Gardens Association. More than 1,650 students live in on-campus residence halls, suites, and apartments in buildings all named for commanders and ships that took part in the Battle of Lake Erie in the War of 1812.

Campus life is enriched by more than 110 clubs and organizations. The athletic program features twenty-one NCAA Division III varsity teams—ten for men and eleven for women—as well as intramural and club sports, and student fitness activities.

As part of a land-grant institution, Penn State Behrend is uniquely positioned to advance the economic, social, and intellectual welfare of northwestern Pennsylvania through research and outreach. Annually, the college funds nearly \$250,000 in undergraduate research opportunities. Outreach efforts include more than two dozen centers, programs, and initiatives for business and industry, area school students, and the community.



# Penn State Behrend Athletic Facilities

## Behrend Fields

The college's soccer teams compete on the Behrend Fields, located northwest of the baseball and softball complex and across the bridge over Trout Run.

The complex comprises four multi-purpose athletic fields and a putting green. The facility was created in 1988, thanks to a pacesetter gift of \$1.4 million from an anonymous donor. The fields are also used for intramurals and course instruction. They accommodate a variety of play configurations, including flag football and softball.

Other outdoor facilities on campus include lighted tennis courts and sand volleyball courts.



## Junker Center

The growth of athletics at Penn State Behrend has led to the development of new indoor facilities. The \$10.2 million Junker Center, which opened in the spring of 2001, comprises 72,800 square feet, including outstanding volleyball and basketball facilities.

The center features three all-purpose courts and a gymnasium seating 1,600, an eight-lane swimming pool, three-lane running track, jumping pits, aerobics room, locker rooms, offices, and a variety of exercise equipment. The fully equipped Jageman Fitness Room provides a variety of exercise equipment for students, faculty, and staff.



## Baseball and Softball Complex

Penn State Behrend's baseball and softball complex, located adjacent to the main campus entrance, ranks as one of the region's best facilities.

Each field features a built-in irrigation system, seventy-foot in-ground dugouts, batting cages, bullpens, scoreboards, a full warning track, permanent fences, a concession stand, and scorekeepers' stations.
